Pedestrian vehicles	Pedestrian vehicles
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A pedestrian vehicle is designed and manufactured for the use of the disabled• It must be less than 48 inches wide have an engine displacement of less than 300 cubic centimeters and less than 12 brake horsepower and not be capable of exceeding 30 mph.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• These vehicles may be used on the highway and are exempt from registration, inspection and operator license requirement.
